TECH TIPS Q&A

Driveline Clunk and-or Vibration

Q: Car year: 2000 car model: 528i - The car has this noise/vibration when I move from park to reverse or from neutral to drive (holding on the brakes). Driving the car, the tranny shifts very well with no noticeable problems; it's just the rumbling noise and vibration. Some independent mechanics have told it is the tranny, but I'm not certain of it yet. I don't want to replace the tranny that is running great.

A: If your 2000 528i is a US model, it will have the A5S-360R transmission. This is a 5-speed automatic. If it is a non-US model, it would have the A5S-325Z (Japan models have the A5S-300J). These are all 5-speed transmissions.

If you have a clunk or other noise when shifting into gear, this may be normal wear/play in the differential, worn u-joints or CV-joint in the driveshaft or perhaps worn transmission mounts. Without driving the car, we would not assume that this is an internal transmission problem with the info that you have given. If there is vibration while driving, this could be the driveshaft u-joints and/or CV-joint, the driveshaft center bearing or the driveshaft flex disc front coupler (as well as other issues).

External Air Temperature Sensor -40, -22, etc.

Q: Car year: 2002 car model: 525i - After a snowstorm drive my sensor in the dash reads -40 all the time. What could be wrong?

A: You likely either have a faulty exterior temperature sensor, the sensor has come unplugged, or the sensor is missing altogether. If the sensor is missing, it would not be uncommon for the harness plug to be ripped from the vehicle's wiring as well. We do carry all of the various model temperature sensors and we have plug repair kits for some of them.

Fault Codes – Fuel Control and Sluggish Oxygen Sensor

Q: Car year: 2004 car model: M3 I purchased a Code Reader from you to read the codes, because I was getting a "Service Engine Soon" message. The codes, from Table 1b are: 90 Fuel control, Bank 1 d6 PreCat oxygen sensor 1 slow response. Can you help me interpret what the problem may be?

A: In this case, the fuel control code could be a secondary result of the sluggish oxygen sensor (which is also for Bank-1). We would suggest replacement of the oxygen sensor as a first course of action. Clear the codes and then see if the fuel control code returns. We would also suggest that you replace both of the pre-cat sensors (bank-1 and bank-2), while you're in there.

Clutch Trouble in Cold Weather

Q: Car year: 1982 car model: 320i - I've got a 1982 320i with 240k on it. Despite its age, it's been extremely well maintained. It's facing its first winter this year and so far, so good. The one issue I've had is with the clutch. The clutch was engaging further and further down the motion, and eventually drained. I had the whole brake and clutch system drained and checked for leaks; none were found. After a few weeks, it happened again. I was told that the cold weather (I live in Ottawa, Canada, and it gets COLD up here!) causes shrinking in one of the pieces, allowing air into the system. I was told that there wasn't much I could do, and that I could expect to replace my clutch (or parts of it) at least once each winter. I love my Bimmer and would gladly do it, but before committing to doing so, I wonder: 1) Is this indeed true of all old Bimmers like mine? 2) Assuming my mechanic is correct, is there anything I can do to prevent the cold weather from allowing air into my system? Any advice greatly appreciated.

A: From your description, we would assume that either the clutch master cylinder or the slave cylinder is bypassing fluid past the piston seal. If there is no fluid leakage from the bottom of the transmission bell housing (this is where fluid from a leaking slave cylinder would show up), then it's likely that the master cylinder is bypassing fluid. If both cylinders are aged, we would recommend that you just replace both and bleed the system. There is no reason that new/fresh cylinders would not handle the cold weather.

Fault Codes – P0313, P0171, P0172 Misfire with Low Fuel, etc.

Q: Car year: 2002 car model: 330i - My car seems to run well but my check engine light has come on. When I check the OBD-II codes I get these three: P0313 Misfire detected with low fuel, P0171 System to lean bank 2, P0172 System to lean bank 1. I did not find a matching response to another question that matched my model and was hoping that you could provide guidance on what to replace or repair. Thanks for your help.

A: The codes that you have mentioned may have various core possibilities, but we would consider a weak fuel pump as a likely fault. We have seen these codes prior to fuel pump failures, on various later model BMWs. Have you cleared the codes and have they come back? If the codes were cleared and did not return, we would chalk it up to a low fuel condition. However, if the codes do return, then we would recommend testing the operating fuel flow and pressure (using a fuel pressure gauge). If a flow test and/or the operating pressure are below specifications (as in the Bentley repair manual), the pump should be replaced.




To top it off he has the truest badge of car guy status, the Matco Tools calendar hanging from the wall. Nice, real nice.

The 1968 BMW 2000 catalog states: "The feeling of superiority that you will experience in your BMW 2000 is founded in its careful design and construction." Well, there it is—that BMW owners are snobby seeds was planted 43 years ago.

The marketing guys of the '70's were really on the top of the games. One of the 2002tii brochures starts off by claiming, "The United States has just about the best road system in the world."
